To help preserve the beauty of the area and ensure a respectful experience for everyone, please follow these guidelines:

Respect the peace of the place.



Slovenj Gradec is rich in cultural heritage. In cultural institutions, sacred sites, and outdoor cultural points, behave respectfully—keep your voice down and avoid disturbing other visitors.

Art lives here - treat it with care.



Do not touch or damage historical objects, artworks, or architectural elements. They are part of the town's cultural identity and must be preserved. Take photos only where and how it is permitted.

Help protect cultural heritage.



Every monument, old street, and historic building carries meaning. Follow local rules and contribute to their preservation with small acts of respect.

Support local.



Taste local dishes, visit local creators and artisans—your support helps keep tradition and community life alive.



Greet the locals.

A warm word and a friendly smile are part of our culture. Visitors who show respect are always welcome.



Move responsibly.

Use marked paths to avoid damaging soil and habitats of rare plants. Follow instructions and remember that you share nature with others.



Act sustainably.

Explore the destination on foot or by bike to reduce your environmental impact and experience the place more authentically.



Leave no trace.

Do not litter, pick or damage plants, or move stones. Every part of nature has its place and purpose. Let the beauty remain for those who come after you.



Do not disturb wildlife.

Wild animals should remain wild—do not approach, feed, or frighten them with noise.



Help preserve the sounds of nature.

Loud music, motor vehicles, and shouting disturb wildlife and other visitors. Let nature speak for itself.



Use resources wisely.

Use tap water and energy responsibly, and reduce plastic waste by choosing sustainable products.



Photograph with sensitivity.

Capture beauty, not someone's privacy. Always ask for permission before photographing people or religious ceremonies.



Pass the respect forward.

Lead by example and show others how wonderful it is when we treat nature and cultural heritage responsibly.
